The world at the age of 18

Spain. Iñaki Recalde.

He will be 18 next 27th November. He lives in the residential area of Indautxu, in Bilbao. His father is a doctor, his mother works at home. He has two brothers. He is studying Business at the University of Deusto.

“I was born in Bilbao, my parents were also born here and my four grandparents. I think this is the city where I want to live.[...] My mother is a housewife and my father works as a doctor in a outpatients` department. I have two younger brothers, one is 14 and the other 12. We all live together.[...] I have always studied in a Jesuit School, now I`m going to start my university course at the University of Deusto. I`m studying Business Administration. I`d like to be a business man. I`d like to work in something related to travelling and meeting people, perhaps, in a big hotels or restaurants chain.
[...]

How would I define myself? I don`t know it very well. I like being alone, but also with people. I`ve got a few friends but good ones. I`m very selective. My mother says I`ve got a very...what is the word she uses?, steady character...I never get angry, and I`m not a violent person at all. Emotionally, I`m a well balanced person.
[...]

My family is very protectionist, but they also let my brothers and me assume our own responsibilities. I like having a tranquil life. On Friday evenings, we like going to parties on campus. I play sports most of Saturday. I like all of them: tennis, swimming, football, cycling, jogging. I practise a lot of sports. [...] In the evening, I study and I go out with my friends; we talk and have something to drink. On Sundays, I go to church with my friends and brothers, I know this can be surprising. However, I`m not a religious person, I`ve got very personal beliefs. I believe in Jesus` values but I don`t think these values are exclusive to Christianity. I don`t know, I have some doubt. I can see how religion is used in a wrong way, in a very selfish way by some people. They hold on to it as if it were a life jacket.

I read the newspapers every day; the section I`m less interested in is the one about politics. In general, I see politicians as very cheeky people. I know I can vote now, but the problem is that I don`t know to whom. There is no one who fulfils my expectations. On TV, I like watching sports, the news and some series such as “*Aquí no hay quien viva*” y *CSI*. The last book I`ve read is “*Da Vinci Code*”, impressive. I`ve got a computer in my room, but no, I`m not hooked on it. I prefer going out with my friends or moving to the sitting room to talk to my parents.
[...]

Travelling? I`ve been very lucky to travel around a lot with my family. [...] I love travelling with my family. Eating nice food and playing sport is something that I wouldn`t change by anything in the world. In my trips, I`ve learnt that there are a lot of different people. I was shocked by Paris, and by Venetian nights. From Spain, I`ve also learnt about its diversity, it is the most beautiful thing it has: diversity.

About the world, I feel sorry for the conflict between Israel and Palestine. As I`m also sorry for the conflict here between the Basque Country and Spain. How do you solve these conflicts? I think there is only one way: we all have to give something up.
[...]

Something that I`m afraid of? Losing my physical height, getting blind, losing one leg, cancer, aids...I don`t now how I would react.”
